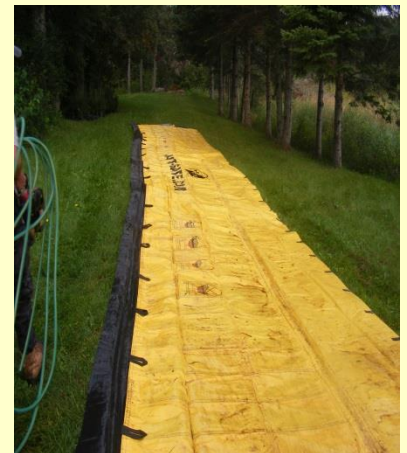

Coffer Dam Demonstration



CBWA recently deployed our mobile coffer dam, in order to demonstrate the set up and proper use to our newest staff members. CBWA purchased the coffer dam in 2020 and since then, it has proven to be a valuable tool when completing work in the streams. The coffer dam allows the workers to engage in working “in the dry” by blocking the water flow in the stream and diverting the water downstream via an overflow diverter. This tool means a very efficient and cost effective method of adhering to DFO regulations requiring work to be done “in the dry”. CBWA will be using this coffer dam during a bridge-building project on the upper reaches of Long Creek in the upcoming weeks.

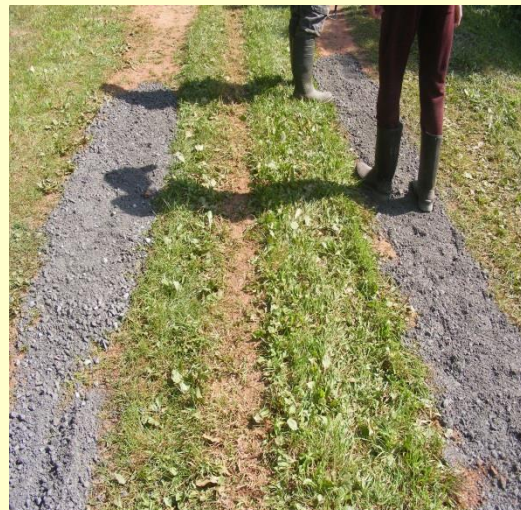
Bank Swallows Spotted in Kildare

The Bank Swallow's biggest threat is loss of habitat as a result of increased erosion, reclamation of sandpits and quarries, and installation of erosion control measures along shorelines.
