With the assistance of students from the STARS program, CBWA staff re-established the bank with rocks and filter-fabric - therefore re-directing the stream flow and deepening the channel. Beaver Dams at Marchbanks



CBWA staff discovered three beaver dams in the Marchbanks pond this summer - Two large dams, and one small one. The dams are causing some major blockages and debris is piling up. We have contacted the local trapper, and once the beavers are safely removed from the area we will repair the damages caused to this estuary. Our primary objective is to restore the normal stream flow while limiting the movement and impact of sediment stored within the beaver impoundments, and minimize the impacts on water temperature and dissolved oxygen.
